HOW TO CITE A WEB PAGE (MLA STYLE)

1. Name of author or creator	2. Title of specific web page, article, image, or photo in quotation marks	3. Name of entire web site in italics	4. Publisher or sponsor of site (if none, use N.p.)	5. Date web page was created or last revised (if no date, use n.d.)	6. Medium	7. Date you viewed the web page

1. Name of author or creator	2. Title of the image in italics	3. Year image was created (if no date, use n.d.)	4. Museum that houses the work, City	5. Name of entire web site in italics	6. Medium	7. Date you viewed the web page
LastName, FirstName.	<i>Capitalize First Letter of Important Words.</i>	Year.	Museum Name, City.	<i>Capitalize First Letter of Important Words.</i>	Web.	Day Month Year.
