A few scheduling reminders...

- The level of placement in an academic class is determined by performance. In order to move up a level, a student must have an “A” or “B” average and a teacher recommendation. In order to maintain a level, a student must have a “C” or better.
- Provide at least 3 alternate elective choices, including English electives.
- You should try to take the highest level course in which you can earn a “B” or better. Colleges do not look favorably on final grades of C’s and D’s in honors/AP courses. It is important to note that NHHS will not report class rank. Grades will be your most important asset!
- All students are required to carry 35 credits per year.
- If you are requesting any AP classes, you must have the AP Approval Form filled out. If you are requesting more than 3 AP classes, you must have Mr. Hahola sign the form before submitting it to guidance. Some departments require separate applications, make sure you complete these!
- All scheduling contracts are due in guidance by **January 19, 2010!** Classes fill up, so if you want to get your first choice selections, then hand them in early!
- All seniors should be scheduling for the following courses: (please review options on the back of this sheet)
 - English*
 - PE/Health 12
 - Public Speaking (if you have not completed it)
 - World Language (if you have not completed two years of the same language)
 - Fine/Performing and Practical Arts (5 credits each, if you have not completed it)

* Advanced Expo for review of college essay is strongly recommended.

Parent and teacher signatures are required on all scheduling contracts.

If signatures are missing, the contract will be returned to you.

It is important that your schedule be turned in on time in order to obtain the classes that you want, before they are full. We will schedule classes based on teacher recommendation only!

1 year of Phys. Ed. and Health for every year enrolled in a NJ school
