

Software for Student Aid

Students applying for federal aid for college can speed up the process by downloading a free Windows-based program for IBM-compatible computers. Called FAFSA Express, it replicates the 2005-2006 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Using it can cut weeks off the application process and eliminate the mistakes and problems that sometimes arise when filling out the paper FAFSA form.
