SPECIAL SUMMER PROGRAMS ARE OFFERED AT THE FOLLOWING COLLEGES:

Boston University (Massachusetts) – High School Programs Summer 2009 is offering students 2 – 6 week residential programs: High School Honors, Research Internship in Science & Engineering, and Summer Challenge. The High School Honors Program is for students that are entering their senior year that would like to earn up to 8 college credits to Boston University. The Research Internship in Science & Engineering Program is also for upcoming seniors, while the Summer Challenge program is for upcoming sophomore, juniors, and seniors.
