

A. Visual Project:

Possibilities: Poster, mobile, model, power point presentation, other visuals (must be approved by the teacher first). The visual must be handed-in, including a working CD of a power point presentation, and becomes the property of the school. (Exceptions can be agreed upon in advance with the teacher).

The visuals will be judged on:

- Completeness: Titles, labels, appropriate illustrations
- Accuracy of facts and language, French if possible
- Aspect: neatness, originality, ability to be seen by the class

B. Oral Presentation:

Speak 3 minutes in English and 10 sentences in French.

The oral will be judged on:

- Completeness
- Accuracy of the facts and the language
- Interesting to the class
- Informative for the class

Students may create worksheets (vocabulary lists, fill in the blanks, crosswords, outlines, etc.) which will help others understand their presentations.

Subject of the presentation: The country you chose

- Explain the importance of the country in the Francophone world.
- Why is French used, how much is it used, other languages
- Its place in the world (location, continent, 3rd world country or not, etc.)
- Cities
- Products, unique qualities
- PERTINENT HISTORY (Why do they speak French, are they still a part of France, anything currently happening there with France)

Points will be lost for:

1. Late visual or late oral presentation
2. Reading of the report
3. Disruptive behavior during someone else's report
4. Plagiarism

C. Bibliography:

The student must hand-in a typed bibliography that includes at least three Internet sites and three other sources (books, periodicals, pamphlets). The bibliography should follow the MLA format. See MLA sheet. It is suggested that some of these sources be in French since this can make the student's presentation easier.

D. Presentation:

The student creates and delivers orally 10 sentences relating to the country in French. The sentences should use vocabulary and structures comprehensible for French 2 students.

Exemple: Paris est la capital de la France. La France se trouve en Europe. Etc.

The bibliography and the written version of the ten sentences should be handed in before the presentation, i.e. on December 2nd along with the visual.
