Follow the formula in the table to cite your sound clip. Format the information using the punctuation and styles shown in the table. Then combine the categories of information in the order shown (1-7). If your source does not provide certain information (e.g., creator or date), skip that information and move on to the next category of information.

1. Name or username of creator or poster	2. Title of sound clip/song	3. Description of digital format (MP3, WMA, WAV)	4. Name of web site	5. Date clip/song published or updated	6. Date you downloaded the clip/song	7. URL
