HSPA Information

The High
School Proficiency

Assessment

(HSPA) will measure student achievement in the areas of Mathematics and Language Arts Literacy on March 5, 6 and 7. This test is for the junior class and senior retakes. No backpacks, handbags, cell phones, any other electronic devices, food, or water bottles are allowed in the testing areas. Students should have nothing with them other than pencils and a calculator (for math).

During HSPA testing, we will be running two bus schedules. Students taking the HSPA get on their buses at their regular times. All other students will get on their usual buses two and a half hours later than their normal departure times. The senior a.m. Polytech students should arrive to school by

7:40 a.m. and take their normal bus to Polytech.

Every student must present a North Hunterdon High School I.D. card or a driver's license each day of testing before they will be allowed to participate in HSPA testing.

Advanced Placement Tests



Please order all AP Exams by Friday, March 22, 2013.

The cost is \$89 per test and must be paid at the time of ordering. Students need to bring their completed registration form and a check made payable to NHHS Activities Account to the main office. Please

do not hand checks or registration forms to the classroom teacher. Mrs. Sulla, in the Principal's office, will record and process all registrations and checks. Please write on the check the exams that your child will be taking, and please record the child's last name if different than that on the check.

A reminder to all students and parents is that course weighting is dependent upon participation in the AP Exams. Students who take the AP Exam for a course will receive the full AP.50 quality point for GPA calculations. Students who choose not to participate in an AP Exam for a course will receive Honors Weighting .35 quality point for GPA calculations. Weighting is not dependant upon the AP Exam Grade; only participation in the exam for that course is considered.

ASVAB



On Thursday, March 28, 2013, all Sophomores will take the AS-VAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) Test at 8:00AM in the New Gym. It is important to note that taking this

test does not imply that a student is interested in the military and is <u>not obligated to any of the armed services</u> for taking the test. This test is a key component of the North Hunterdon High School's Personalized Student Learning Plan.

The ASVAB test is a comprehensive career test that includes the most widely used multiple aptitude test battery in the world. The ASVAB program also offers an interest inventory and other activities designed to help students explore the world of work and gain confidence in making career decisions. The results of the aptitude test and interest inventory enable students to evaluate their skills, estimate their performance in academic and vocational endeavors, and identify potentially satisfying careers.

The ASVAB test consists of eight sections containing 200 items and requires three hours to complete. The sections include the following: general science, arithmetic reason-

ing, word knowledge, paragraph comprehension, mathematics knowledge, electronics information, auto/ shop information, and mechanical comprehension. General goals of the test include having students learn more about themselves and the world of work, exploring occupations in line with their interests, and developing an effective strategy to realizing their career goals.

The ASVAB test is designed to be helpful to virtually all students, whether they are planning on pursuing a four year college, two year college, vocational school or entering the workforce after high school. Anyone who says today's teens hate to read hasn't met Kaitlyn Weiler. Among NHHS's most avid readers, Kaitlyn checked out 64 books from the Media Center between during the first 5 months of school. Her goal for 2013: Read 200 books.

"I read mainly for enjoyment," Kaitlyn says. "I like imagining the world that goes on inside a book. That's why I like science fiction so much."

Although always a book fan, Kaitlyn ramped up her reading after she joined Good Reads, a social-networking site where readers can track the books they have read, list the books they want to read, and post reviews. "I used to keep my thoughts about a book in my head," says Kaitlyn. "But writing reviews made reading more fun. I can't wait to finish a book and write about it."

Kaitlyn estimates that she reads roughly one book a day. She finds time for reading by keeping screens dark. "I'm not on the computer much, unless it's for school. I don't watch TV, unless it's a movie with my family," she says. "Sometimes I even get yelled at for reading at the dinner table."

And where does Kaitlyn get all those books? The Media Center, of course! "Coming to the Media Center at school is so much easier than going to the county library or a

bookstore," says Kaitlyn. "Plus, the collection here has so many new and updated books."

Kaitlyn's reading performance has been so remarkable that the Media Center created a "Katie's Comments" display of some of her favorite books, annotated with excerpts from her reviews. "As soon as the display went up, students started checking out Kaitlyn's picks," says librarian Martha Hickson. "There's nothing better than a good reader recommending good books."

Health Office Information—Got the Flu?

You suddenly have a cough, headache, body aches, a fever...it could be the FLU. The flu sure can make a person feel miserable, but most people can be safely cared for at home. Getting a flu vaccine every year can help prevent the flu. But, if you do get infected, follow these helpful tips. Check with your child's school for their absence policy. For more information visit: www.nj.gov/flu.

Self Care Tips

- Drink plenty of liquids
- Fat
- Rest
- Use over-the-counter pain relievers such as Tylenol or Advil as needed. (Never give aspirin to children or teenagers who have flu-like symptoms, particularly fever.)
- Gargle with salt water for a sore throat

Protect Others

- Try to avoid close contact with other household members
- Wash hands frequently
- Cover coughs and sneezes with tissues
- Throw used tissues away immediately and wash hands

Call a health care provider if you think you have the flu. They will tell you if you should come in for a visit. Some people are at greater risk of having severe complications from the flu. They may need to be seen by a health care provider. People at greater risk are: older people, pregnant women, young children, and people with chronic medical conditions.

When to Seek Medical Care Quickly

Children

- Fast breathing or trouble breathing
- Blue color to the skin
- Not drinking enough liquids
- Not waking up or not interacting
- Not wanting to be held
- Flu symptoms get better but then return with fever and worse cough
- Fever with a rash

Adults

- Difficulty breathing or short of breath
- Pain or pressure in chest or abdomen
- Sudden dizziness
- Confusion
- Severe vomiting

When Should Children Stay Home from School?

- Seems ill
- Looks pale
- Is not able to comfortable participate in school activities
- Coughs or sneezes more than usual
- Has pain in ears, throat, head or chest



- Is sweaty (when the weather is not hot)
- Has a fever



- Has thrown up in the past 12 hours
- Has had diarrhea two or more times in the past 24 hours

Student Council Dance Marathon



Dan Torrone (Dr. D) kept the music pumping all morning. It was so rewarding to see kids of all groups and abilities come together for such a worthwhile cause.











North Cheerleaders Compete in Orlando, Florida







The North Hunterdon Varsity Cheerleaders competed at the 2013 UCA National High School Cheerleading Championships in Orlando, FL on February 9 and 10. The Large Varsity Division I team of 20 girls were ranked #2 going into Finals after the first round on February 9.

On February 10, the girls cracked the top 5 by placing 5th out of 25 teams in their division for the final ranking. Only 3 points separated the 1st place team from the 5th place team.

The girls had flawless performances in both the semi-final and final rounds. They maxed out in both difficulty and execution for partner stunts and tumbling.

Senior captains Tori Bischoff and Molly Owens were interviewed by Shawn Johnson, Olympic Gold Medalist, who is a representative of UCA. The captains were interviewed immediately following their warm ups for the Final Round, where they were in contention for one of the Top Rankings in the country.

This was the first time in North Hunterdon history that the cheerleaders placed in the Top 5 at UCA Nationals. In 2012 and 2009, they ranked 7th in the Large Varsity division.

The Head Coach of this cheerleading squad is Lori Guida Schuetz, accompanied by Assistant Varsity Cheerleading Coach, Jennifer Jordan.

Coach Guida Schuetz commented, "This squad wanted to reach their goal of making the top 5 in the USA more than anything else in the world. They are an exceptionally focused group of young women. They possess a high level of talent and dedication, but more importantly, they truly care about each other and want to succeed as a unit. They are a family, and that shows when they perform on the mat. Their joy of cheerleading and being with one another is electric, which is how they broke into the top 5 ranking this year.

I am extremely proud of what they have accomplished, as it is a testament to them, their parents, the school community and to the former North Hunterdon cheerleaders who helped pave the way for this team's success."
