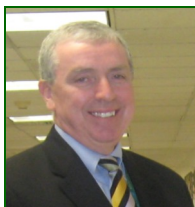

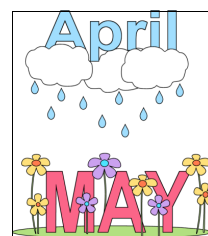
Out of 1,925 schools on the list, North Hunterdon ranked 858 and Voorhees ranked 1,077.

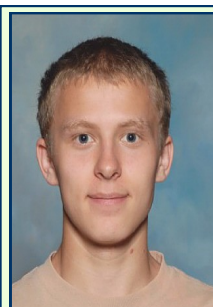


April Students of the Month

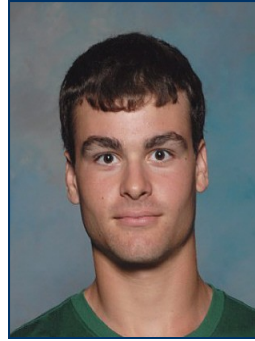
April Athlete of the Month - Cailyn Lavigne '14



Cailyn has had a step-out junior year in running. In the fall, she was a steady force on the Girls' Cross-Country team, leading them to their first Sectional Title in 10 years. The team also ranked #2 in Group IV and #5 in New Jersey. After a strong Indoor Track & Field season and increased training, Cailyn has put out her personal best in the 800 meters this spring. She has

run a team best 2:18 in the half mile and was the driving force behind the 4 x 800 relay team that qualified for the Penn Relays this April. The North girls currently hold the fastest 4 x 800 relay time in the area, and Cailyn Lavigne has been the leader of that effort. They will compete April 25th at the University of Pennsylvania in hopes of qualifying for the Championship of America. Most recently, the girls won the 4 x 1600 M at the Raider Relays, in which Lavigne had the 2nd fastest time on the team.

April Athlete of the Month - Christopher Rasile '13



CJ Rasile, a senior on the Varsity baseball team, has been a key contributor to the team's successful 2013 season. Rasile, #6 and the starting left fielder, is in his second season starting for the Varsity team. CJ's current batting average is an impressive .300, and he has an on base percentage of .346. His performance at the plate has been pivotal to

North Hunterdon's success on the diamond. In the first six games of the season, CJ had 5 RBIs and 3 runs, helping the team start the season off with a 5-1 record. CJ has played baseball since he was six years old and dedicates himself to the sport year round. He also plays during the summer for the North Hunterdon Legion team. In addition to baseball, CJ partakes in winter weight lifting. He also participates in Relay for Life each year. CJ is very glad to play on such a successful Lions baseball team. Next year, he plans to continue playing ball at Mercer County Community College.

Athletic News and Accomplishments

- Congratulations to Erik Adamcik (Pole Vault) and Morgan Harvey (400 m Hurdles) for qualifying for the Penn Relays held April 25-27 at Franklin Field in Philadelphia.
- Congratulations to Nick Skelton, Pete Dehkes, Stephen Swider, Erik Adamcik and Trevor Knowles for first place finishes at the Rebel Relays on 4/6/13.
- On 4/13/13, the North Hunterdon Girls Track team broke the 19 year old Skyland Conference meet record with a 9:35.5 finish. The old record was 9:36.7. Cailyn Lavigne ran a 2:18 split followed by Megan Sergison 2:25, Sally Falk (2:29) and Eve Glasergreen (2:19). The girls placed 6th out of the 17 teams.
- On 4/13/13, the North Hunterdon Boys Varsity Track & Field team placed 5th out of 17 teams at the Skyland Conference Relays.
- The North Girls Lacrosse Team rank #17 out of the top 20 in New Jersey.
- The North Boys Baseball Team rank #16 out of the top 20 in New Jersey.
- At the 8th Annual Raider Relays on 4/20/13, North Hunterdon High School seniors overcame blustery conditions to clear 6-6 in the boys high jump, leading the Lions to victory in the event. It was the highlight performance of annual track and field invitational.
- Nick Skelton, whose personal best in the event is 6-7, paired with Peter Dehkes for a 12-4 total. That was eight inches higher than the next-closest team. Dehkes' personal best is 6-4.
- North Hunterdon picked up two other gold medals, winning the javelin with James Ballance (155-11) and Mitchell Paiker (149-9) and 4x1600 in 18:43 with Samuel Layding (4:39), Nick Seibert (4:50), Matthew Sergison (4:39) and David Folsom (4:32).
- North Hunterdon's girls won the 4x800 and the 4x1600 as Eve Glasergreen provided an impressive 5:09 leg.
- Morgan Harvey placed 14th in the 400m hurdles championship held at the 2013 Penn Relays in Philadelphia Pa. Harvey finished 5th in her heat with a mark of 1:03.63.

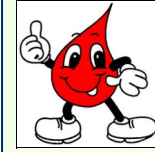
World Language Awards Ceremony

Alive at 25



North Hunterdon-Voorhees Regional High School District is greatly concerned with the safety of our student drivers. Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of deaths among young drivers with less than two years experience.

Therefore, we have implemented a mandatory program, "Alive at 25," for all parents and students that anticipate driving on campus during the 2013-2014 school year. The "Alive at 25" program will address the operational, psychological, and physical aspects of driving.

The student program was conducted during the school day in November 2012 for juniors who had Health first semester and then held in March 2013 for juniors who have Health second semester. This is a program designed to persuade student drivers to take responsibility for their behavior in driving situations and adopt safe driving practices.

The parent program will be offered on a variety of evenings in May. The program will consist of a 1.5 hour pres-

entation to assist parents in understanding and managing the journey of their teens as they progress from beginners to independent drivers. Information will be provided that offers practical information for parents to use in reducing teen crash risks. **The program will be offered at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, May 2, Wednesday, May 15 and Monday, May 20 in the North Hunterdon High School Theater.** Additional information can be found on the North Hunterdon website. Parents must attend only one of the three nights. If you are unable to attend one of the three nights at NHHS, you are able to attend the program at Voorhees High School. The dates for the VHS program are Wednesday, May 21 at 7pm and Wednesday, May 29 at 2:30pm or 7pm in the auditorium.

Scholarship Voting Hosted by the Booster Club



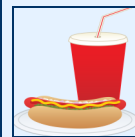
