

# Week of Respect—October 7-11 and School Violence Awareness Week—October 21-25, 2013

In accordance with the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act, the first week of October is classified as the "Week of Respect." The third week in October is designated as "School Violence Awareness Week". These weeks were designed to ensure that all students in our school would receive age appropriate instruction on respecting themselves and others. The theme of respect is instrumental in reducing incidences of bullying and helping students to feel comfortable in our school. North Hunterdon High School observed both weeks in all departments with the following activities:

- Student Council and the Green Dot club led a school-wide effort by creating a "Respect is..." wall in the mall area. Students in their Health and Physical Education classes worked together to define what they believe respect is and the "Green Dots" were displayed in the mall area. In addition, Junior Health classes began their Character Education Unit and discussed respect in detail.
- In the Practical Arts department, all classes worked on creating a project (such as websites, pamphlets, etc.) that focused on respect in the school and the relationship between respect and violence.
- In all levels of the World Language classes, the students engaged in extensive discussions on respecting culture, differences, language, etc. Students were provided with vocabulary in their respective languages that relate to respect.
- The English department provided all North Hunterdon High School students with a "North Hunterdon Respect Rep" business card as a tangible reminder of the integral part respect plays in the life of a North Hunterdon High School student. Teachers also discussed the theme of respect in relation to the role it plays in every person's life as well as in the lives of the characters being studied in their literature classes.
- Science classes focused on respecting our school and environment.
- The Math department focused on respecting those around us in the classroom, at extracurricular activities, and the community.
- Posters from the We Tip Bully organization were posted throughout the building. The posters encouraged students to report bullying when they see it occurring.
- The Social Studies department focused on respecting society and how showing respect translates to lower incidences of bullying and harassment.
- The Friends of Rachel club posted "chain reaction links" around the school with messages of respect from Rachel Scott, the first victim of the Columbine school tragedy.

## Stressed????



High school students encounter stress from many facets of life: school, sports, clubs, friends, etc. Some students can work through the stress with mild stress coping activities such as listening to music or exercising, while other students may need additional support from their par-

ents or a school counselor. For many students, stress creates a behavioral change including acting irritable or moody, withdrawing from activities that used to give them pleasure, routinely expressing worries, complaining more than usual about school, crying, sleeping too much or too little, or eating too much or too little. Teens tend to spend more time with and confiding in peers and that is a normal part of growing up, but significantly avoiding parents, abandoning long-time friendships for a new set of peers or expressing excessive hostility toward family members, may indicate that the teen is experiencing significant stress. While negative behavior is not always linked to excessive stress, negative changes in behavior are almost always a clear indication that something is wrong.

Here are some stress reduction techniques:

- 1. Meditate
- **2. Breathe Deeply**—this helps to reduce your body's reaction to stress.
- **3. Be Present**—live in the moment and don't think about the next place you need to be.
- 4. **Reach Out**—talk to your parents/guardians, siblings, friends, teachers, counselor, coach or anyone you feel comfortable speaking to.
- **5. Decompress**—sit with a warm towel, take a bath or warm shower.
- **6. Laugh Out Loud—**a good laugh can help to reduce your mental load!
- **7. Crank Up the Tunes**—research shows that music can lower blood pressure, heart rate and anxiety all of which increase when stressed.
- **8. Get Moving**-while exercise isn't always a priority, all forms of exercise-from walking to running to training-can minimize stress and anxiety.


