April News

North Hunterdon High School has partnered with El Bohio High School, located on the outskirts of Cartagena, Spain, to host 14 exchange students. This is the first visit to North Hunterdon High School from El Bohio High School, which is located in a medium sized town on the Mediterranean coast. In the last decade, El Bohio High School has become very popular thanks to a bilingual program in which students have the opportunity of receiving more English lessons and partially studying two subjects in that language. All the students traveling are from this bi-lingual section.

The visiting students began shadowing their host "siblings" on Friday, March 11th with a welcome from Dr. Bergacs who gave them a tour of the school.

Spring sports season is upon us, which can mean hundreds of athletes and spectators on the North Hunterdon High School campus at any given time. Please read the following reminders regarding parking lot safety so that cars, buses and emergency vehicles can move through our parking lots without incident.

Parking Lot Safety

- Parking in undesignated areas in the Route 31 parking lot is prohibited.
- Do not park on the road next to the softball field, field hockey field and visitor bleachers. This has caused major traffic issues and must be avoided.
- Parking in any fire lane is prohibited.
- Do not park on the side of the ramp leading down to the District Office parking lot. This has caused fender benders and has prevented buses from moving through to the bus lot.
- Parking on the ramp to the Lion's Den parking lot is prohibited. Parking in undesignated spots in the Lion's Den area prevents athletic buses from dropping off/picking up students.
- No cars should be idle around the circle on the Regional Road side or the Route 31 side. Buses pick up and drop off students at any given time and have priority.
- The speed limit is 5 mph.
- All vehicles on campus must yield to pedestrians and school buses.
- Be courteous to the buses parked, unloading and loading students and equipment, entering and leaving the campus.

Reminder: Pets on property—Dogs and other pets (except guide animals) are prohibited on school property.






From the desk of Dr. Bergacs:


