CLINTON TWP. – The North Hunterdon High School softball team literally squeezed out a win Sunday night.

Senior Jess Nolan's one-out squeeze bunt scored sophomore Cate Sand in the top of the 10th inning to lift North Hunterdon, No. 11 in the latest NJ.com Top 20 rankings, to a dramatic 6-5 victory over No. 9 Vineland in the NJSIAA Group 4 Final at Kean University's Cougar Field in Union Sunday.

North Hunterdon (25-5), which has won four straight, seven of its last eight games and won the Group 4 title for the first time since 2014, advanced to the Tournament of Champions (TOC).

The Lions are seeded third in the TOC and were scheduled to face sixth-seeded and Non-Public B champion Lodi Immaculate at Ivy Hill Park in Newark on Tuesday.

Lodi Immaculate (20-7) has won three straight and nine of its last 10 games.

The winner will advance to Wednesday's semifinals and will face second-seeded Robbinsville, the Group 2 champ, also at Ivy Hill with first pitch scheduled for 5 p.m.
