North Hunterdon High School is a comprehensive secondary (grades 9-12) school with a student population of 1293 (319 in the current senior class). These numbers do not include 178 Hunterdon County Vocational School District students (including 41 seniors) who attend North Hunterdon for all academic courses. The faculty numbers 133 , approximately $63 \%$ with advanced degrees. The current certified staff-to-student ratio is 11 to 1

## Accreditation

North Hunterdon High School is fully accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools and is fully approved by the New Jersey State Department of Education.

## District and Community

North Hunterdon High School is one of the two high schools which comprise the North Hunterdon-Voorhees Regional High School District. The district serves 12 communities in Northwestern New Jersey, located equidistant between Philadelphia and New York City. A sophisticated suburban area that has maintained a desired rural atmosphere, the district attracts a professional and managerial population. The community demands excellence within its school system.

## Class Rank

North Hunterdon High School does not publish class rank. The rationale for this decision is based upon the belief that rank in class is not an accurate representation of a specific student's academic performance, as compared to peers where high performance is the norm. Additionally, students are frequently separated by differences as small as $1 / 100,000$ of a point. To help you understand the student in the context of our highly competitive student body, additional information is provided. Included is a listing of our course of studies, as well as our grading system.

## Curriculum

The college preparatory curriculum is designed to develop individual potential while meeting the entrance requirements of America's most competitive colleges. The rigorous program of studies contains a full complement of college preparatory courses and a comprehensive vocational/technical program. Each academic discipline offers advanced, honors level and advanced placement options. Students may choose from a wide variety of offerings in elective fields. Students are required to carry a minimum of 35 credits per academic year and a total minimum requirement of 120 credits for graduation.

## GPA

GPA reflects a student's cumulative average beginning with grade 9 . Transcripts reflect the GPA at the end of the junior year. The GPA is computed as a weighted percentage. For AP courses, an additional $5 \%$ of the final course grade is added. For all honors courses, an additional $3 \%$ of the final course grade is added.
