

## North Hunterdon Athletic Hall of Fame 2018-2019 Induction Information

Members of the two latest classes for the North Hunterdon High School Athletic Hall of Fame have been selected.

The list for 2018 and 2019 includes: 11 athletes stretching back to the 1960s, two coaches, two teams, and three contributors to the school athletic program. They join the latest group selected for the hall, which inducted its first class in 2002.

The induction luncheon ceremony will start at 11 a.m. Saturday, Oct. 12, at Beaver Brook Country Club, 25 Country Club Drive, Clinton Township.

### The Class of 2018:

#### Athletes:

**George Zack**, Class of 1960, a two-way tackle on county-winning football teams and a district place winner in wrestling.

**George Wilbur**, Class of 1963, a power-hitting outfielder and a tight end and PAT kicker on football teams.

**Ali Freedman**, Class of 2007, first undefeated softball pitcher and 20-game winner. She led state-champion team in 2006.

**Jason Knapp**, Class of 2008, a first-team all-state pitcher and Star-Ledger pitcher of the year as a senior.

**Debora Bowden**, Class of 1992, a champion-level diver for four years and winner of the state competition as a senior. She was a bronze medalist in the 3-meter national championships, and

**Patrick Dolan**, Class of 1993, a first-team all-state runner on 1992 state-championship cross country team and state champion in both 1600 and 3200 in winter track.

### Team:

**The 1989-90 girls' state champion winter track shuttle hurdles relay team** of Andza Wegrzynowicz, Robyn Pangi, Nicole Brown and Kara Spencer. They also won the 1988-89 Princeton relay championship in the event.

### Coach:

**Harold "Skip" Norcross**, coach of girls' track teams, including 1982 state champions, and assistant in basketball, cross country and soccer programs.

### Contributor:

**William Hauck**, class of 1982, president and football and baseball player. Now he is home football games announcer, basketball statistician for boys and girls teams and Hall of Fame committee treasurer.

## The Class of 2019:

### Athletes:

**Christopher Dolan**, Class of 1996, a key runner on three state championship cross-country teams. Only four runners from other teams beat him in races in his senior year.

**Jenna Gonzalez**, Class of 2008, a pitcher on the state-champion 2006 softball team who posted a school-record 22 wins on a sectional championship-winning team in 2008.

**Hilary Murray**, Class of 2008, who notched 18 shutouts in her two seasons as goalie on the soccer team, batted leadoff and played center field in softball and was a scoring, rebounding and assist threat in basketball.

**Carly Becker**, Class of 2006, a fencer who led the foil team to championships and was herself an individual state champion.

**John Marchak**, Class of 1970, a three-sport athlete who placed second in the state wrestling championships in his senior season.

### Teams:

**The 1967 and 1968 girls' field hockey teams.** In 1967, it went 10-0-2; in 1968, the record was 10-1-1 and unofficial "state champs" after winning all games in the highest-caliber post-season tournament at the time.

### Coach:

**Jeffrey Steele**, who led the 2006 girls' softball team to sectional, group and state championships, and the 2007 and 2008 teams to sectional titles, accumulating a career 190-67 record in 9 years.

### Contributors:

**James Crossin**, founder of the Hunterdon Lions Track Club, the youth feeder program for the high school cross country and track teams stretching back to the 1980s.

**John McGourty Sr.**, a 40-year member and often president of the school booster club who was a leader in the push for the private funding of football stadium lights.
