# College Bound Individual College Coaching

#### ♦ Ongoing throughout July and August

Sign up for a one hour long individual coaching session with an experienced college coach. A coach will provide personalized counsel, strategies and planning to effectively navigate the college admissions process. The coaching will consist of three components:

- 1. Introductory emails/call to identify and align areas of focus;
- 2. A one hour in-person meeting;
- 3. A written summary at the completion of the engagement.

Fee is \$50.00 for a 1 hour session
