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## **Update on District Projects**

Using the first semester of this school year, the North Hunterdon-Voorhees district has been busy working on several projects:

- The high school district embarked on developing a new five-year **Strategic Plan**. Over 50 volunteers helped in the planning process and in the end, 18 different goals were established. The Strategic Plan is on the agenda to be accepted by the Board of Education on February 28, 2012. Yearly updates on the progress towards meeting the new goals will be provided to the public. <u>Click here</u> to view the final strategic plan.
- In an effort to find alternative • revenue sources, the district has contracted with UMB CardPartner to launch a VISA<sup>®</sup> Platinum Rewards Credit Card Program. There are two designs for the credit card, one representing each high school. For each credit card that is issued and activated by the user, the district will receive \$50 from the bank. In addition, the district will receive a percentage of purchases charged to the card. Cardholders will receive one reward point for every dollar spent. - In October 2011, the Board of Education had two of its members resign for personal reasons. Two candidates applied for the High Bridge/Lebanon Township open seat and four applied for the Clinton Township/Lebanon Borough open seat. After interviewing all of the candidates, the Board appointed Colleen Ingram to the High Bridge/Lebanon Township seat, and Marc Strauss to the Clinton Township/Lebanon Borough seat. Both new members will serve until the reorganization meeting in January and will have the opportunity to run for the remainder of the term they are filling.
- At the December 13, 2011 Board of Education meeting, the district's auditors from Suplee, Clooney & Co. reviewed the audit report for the 2010-2011 school year. The auditors made no recommendations.
- The Board of Education and administration are currently developing the budget for the 2012-2013 school year. The public budget hearing will be on March 27, 2012 at 7:00pm in the North Hunterdon High School library. Information on the budget will be posted on the district website when available.

## **Students Nationally Recognized**

tudents from both high schools have been recognized on the national level through the 2012 National Merit Scholarship Competition and as the College Board's Advanced Placement Scholars.

For the National Merit Scholarship Competition, two seniors (Harrison Bergman from Voorhees and

Ashley Weaver from North Hunterdon) have been selected as Finalists. About half of the students named as Finalists will be chosen to receive a \$2,500 scholarship. Twenty-six seniors from our district were selected as Commended Students. Students were selected based on their scores on the 2010 Preliminary SAT exam.

Voorhees senior Harrison Bergman was also selected to apply for this year's competition to possibly become a U.S. Presidential Scholar. Students must be selected in order to apply. From the students that apply, approximately 500 are named as semi-finalists. A Commission reviews the semi-finalists' application materials and then chooses 141 students to be named as U.S. Presidential Scholars. Scholars are honored during National Recognition Weekend held in June in Washington, D.C., and will receive a medallion at a ceremony sponsored by the White House.

The College Board has named 163 students at North Hunterdon and 64 students at Voorhees as Ad-

> vanced Placement Scholars on a variety of levels. Students were selected based on scores from the Advanced Placement exams taken in May 2011.

Most notably, 15 students from North Hunterdon and 5 students at Voorhees earned National AP Scholar Awards. To obtain this award, a student must have received an average score of 4 or 5 (on a five-point scale) on all AP exams taken,

and scores of 4 or 5 on eight or more of these exams. Most four-year colleges in the U.S. provide college credit and/or advanced placement for qualifying exam scores (typically 3 or higher).

## **State Department of Education News**

P lease see the following information on state mandates from the Department of Education.

- Our high schools have instituted the new state mandated Financial Literacy course. This new half year course will teach students about personal finance and money management; students will develop skills that promote personal and financial responsibility related to financial planning, savings, investment and charitable giving in the global economy. Financial Literacy is a graduation requirement for those students who are graduating in 2014 or later.
- All members currently serving on a public school or charter school Board of Education must have com-

pleted a criminal background check in order to continue serving on the Board. All of the members on the North Hunterdon-Voorhees Board of Education have completed the criminal background checks and no one has been dismissed.

All juniors will take the High School Proficiency Assessment (HSPA) on March 6, 7, and 8 this year.
On these dates, students taking the test will arrive at school at the normal time. Students NOT taking the test will arrive 2 1/2 hours after the normal time.
More information on the HSPA testing has been sent out by each high school to parents.

## **Blood Drive Award Given to North Hunterdon High School**

t the December 13, 2011 Board of Education meeting, Barbara Pearson from New Jersey Blood Services presented North Hunterdon High School with an award for collecting over 1,000 pints of blood at its drives during the 2010-2011 school year. The high school collected 1,065 pints to be exact. Steven DeLorenzo, North Hunterdon guidance counselor and blood drive coordinator, accepted the award on the school's behalf.

North Hunterdon High School continues to collect more pints of blood in one year than any other high school in the tri-state area, with Voorhees High School in a close second place. North Hunterdon is also participating in Club 25 International, which is a program that pairs blood-donating U.S. high schools with participating schools in South Africa and encourages students to donate 25 times before their 25th birthday (www.club25online.org/).



"I hope we continue to lead the way in educating and inspiring our youth to become life-long blood donors and, in turn, provide the gift of life for others in need," said DeLorenzo.



## **Board of Education—Reapportionment**

s per the education laws guiding regional public school districts, seats on a regional Board of Education are determined in large part by the population of the municipalities residing in that regional district. From the results of the 2010 Census, the North Hunterdon-Voorhees Board of Education will undergo some changes through reapportionment as population has changed in several areas.

The Board of Education currently consists of 13 members, and this will be reduced to 12 members beginning at the reorganization meeting the first week of January 2013. Changes to seats will be as follows:

- 2 seats for Bethlehem Twp/Glen Gardner/ Hampton will become 1 seat for Bethlehem Twp/Hampton
- 1 seat for Clinton/Franklin Twp will become 2 seats for Clinton/Glen Gardner/Franklin Twp
- 2 seats for Union Twp will become 1 seat for

#### Union Twp

Seats for Clinton Twp/Lebanon Borough, Califon/ Tewksbury Twp, and High Bridge/Lebanon Twp will remain as is.

The seats listed above will be up for election and placed on the ballot in November 2012. In addition, two seats with unexpired terms (currently held by appointed members) will be on the November ballot: High Bridge/Lebanon Twp - 1 year unexpired term, and Clinton Twp/Lebanon Borough -2 year unexpired term.

Board of Education members who currently hold seats that will be affected by changes through reapportionment will have to run in the next school elections for the new seat (if they wish). Nominating petitions for Board candidates will be posted on the district website when available. As school elections have been moved to November, nominating petitions will be due by June 5, 2012 to the Hunterdon County Clerk's office.

#### **Voorhees Staff Members Selected for Special Programs**

wo staff members from Voorhees High School will have the opportunity to participate in two unique college programs.

Social Studies teacher, Reid Kirby, has been selected to attend Princeton University's East Asian Studies Seminar for Teachers. This seminar is being held from November 2011 to May 2012.

The seminar focuses on the traditions, experiences and modern influences of East Asia through an interdisciplinary approach.

"The opportunity to study at such a prestigious institution, to gain a useful variety of classroom materials, to interact with other like-minded peers, and to pass this experience on to my students is an exciting opportunity that I am very much looking forward to," said Kirby.

Kirby hopes to gain a better understanding of the rich traditions rooted in the Far East, and believes the seminar materials will have an integral and consistent place in his World History classes. During a workshop at Arcadia University on December 2, 2011, Voorhees Guidance Counselor, Jean DiSalvio, was randomly chosen from 160 names to participate in the university's 2012 China Preview for High School Educators.

DiSalvio will travel to China on June 19, 2012 with Arcadia faculty and students for a 10-day trip. The trip will include visits to Xi'an University, Xi'an Bell Tower, sites in Jiaozhou and the Great Wall in Beijing.

"I am extremely grateful to have been given this opportunity. In my daily work with high school students, I am expected to guide them toward making decisions that will have a positive impact on their lives and help them achieve their academic and career goals. I have no doubt that the China Preview experience will help me do just that. Everyone can derive some benefit from widening their horizons, facing obstacles, learning and growing through it all," said DiSalvio.

#### **Professional Development Programs**

Throughout each school year, our district provides eight in-service dates to allow for professional development for our staff. While students leave school at noon on these days, staff members stay to attend a variety of different workshops, many of which are state mandated. In addition to workshops, these half days also allow departments to meet together to discuss curriculum, common practices and new things they have learned in their discipline.
